Attention-NEW HEALTH REGULATIONS: IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT ALL MEDICINES COME TO CAMP IN THE ORIGINAL PRESCRIBED CONTAINERS; NO OTHER WAY WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Camper Letters: Campers like to receive letters, so we urge you to write and send out by the Tuesday before camp to allow the mail time to reach the camp.

One Way Camper Email: Parents/Guardians will use the **Online Registration** dashboard to access **FREE** one way emails that will get sent to your camper during their week of camp. Parents/Guardians can also invite other family members and or friends to email their camper through the **FREE** email service. Again this is done through **Online Registration Dashboard**.

Camper Photos: Butman Methodist Camp will be posting pictures to our **FACEBOOK** page daily. Just click on your camps photo album to view camper's pictures taken during camp activities. Parents/Guardians may opt out of pictures of their camper(s); this will need to be expressed to the camp director at check-in registration.

Medical Exclusions

An ill camper cannot be accepted for a camping event. If on the day of camp one or more of the following exist, please do not bring your camper to camp.

- The illness prevents the camper from participating comfortably in camping activities.
- The illness results in a greater need for care than the staff can provide without compromising the health, safety, and supervision of the other campers.
- The camper has any of the following:
 - Temperature of 100 F or higher; Armpit temperature 99 F or higher
 - AND has behavioral changes or other signs and symptoms of illness until medical evaluation indicates that the camper can be included in camping activities OR
 - Symptoms and signs of severe illness, such as:
 - Lethargy
 - H1 N1 Virus
 - Difficulty breathing
 - Uncontrolled Diarrhea (2 or more loose, watery stools in 24 hours)
 - Vomiting illness (2 or more episodes in 24 hours)
 - Rash with fever
 - Mouth sores with drooling
 - Head lice
 - Wheezing
 - Behavior change or other unusual signs
UNTIL medical evaluation indicates that the camper can be included in camping activities, or
 - The camper has been diagnosed with a communicable disease, UNTIL medical evaluation indicates that the camper is no longer contagious and is able to be included in camping activities.
 - The Camp will not accept a DNR but will accept the camper
