Medical Exclusions

An ill child cannot be accepted for a camping event. If on the day of camp one or more of the following exist, please do not bring your child to camp.

- The illness prevents the child from participating comfortably in camping activities.
- The illness results in a greater need for care than the staff can provide without compromising the health, safety, and supervision of the other campers.
- The child has any of the following:
 - A temperature of 100.1 F or higher
 - Has behavioral changes or other signs and symptoms of illness until medical evaluation indicates that the child can be included in camping activities OR
 - Symptoms and signs of severe illness, such as:
 - o Lethargy or Fatigue
 - o COVID-19
 - o H1N1 Virus
 - o Difficulty breathing
 - o Uncontrolled Diarrhea (2 or more loose, watery stools in 24 hours)
 - o Vomiting illness (2 or more episodes in 24 hours)
 - o Rash
 - o Fever
 - o Mouth sores with drooling
 - o Head lice
 - o <u>Wheezing</u>
 - <u>Behavior change or other unusual signs</u> UNTIL medical evaluation indicates that the child can be included in camping activities, Or
 - The child has been diagnosed with a communicable disease, UNTIL medical evaluation indicates that the child is no longer contagious and is able to be included in camping activities.
